## pediatric cancer facts\*

- On average **130 children** are newly diagnosed with pediatric each year in Alabama
- On average **25–30 young people** received blood or bone marrow transplants each year in Alabama
- Childhood cancer is the **leading cause of death by disease** in children & adolescents
- The average high school has **three students** who are cancer survivors or who are in treatment for a childhood cancer
- **15,780** children and teens will be diagnosed with cancer this year in the U.S.
